### \* Water Tower

- History:
  - When Legacy Oaks Community was being built, VF and other neighborhoods protested successfully as a group to prohibit new commercial business.
  - Pulte agreed to scale down the project- now ranch homes averaging \$550k -\$650k (representative for the current area)
  - o 11 acres were donated by the Ressler family to the City of Westfield as a park
    - Mayor decided this park would require too much upkeep and gave the land back to the Ressler family
- APC December 2019
  - Recommended 11 acres rezoned residential (SF1 / SF2)
- The city of Westfield decided a maximum of 3 (three) homes on the average lots
- Today, Citizens Energy Group -
  - Came to the City of Westfield and purchased 1 (one) acre parcel to put a water tower on the parcel. Nothing in the state code addressing this
- U.D.O. (Unified Development Code)
  - Our U.D.O. does not matter state statutes take over, therefore there is nothing the city can do to stop the project itself, however, they have pushed Citizens to modify this project in such a way that it better suits its surroundings
- The original plan was for a 70' diameter around storage take
  - o This plan was for a 40'on sides x 60' center high steel dome
  - o 7' Chain-link fence
  - 53 arborvitae(s)
- New Proposal Accepted by City
  - o Replace steel dome
  - o 60' x100' Concrete Building with a height of 25.3'
  - o Additional arborvitae(s) 173 trees total
  - o This option will be much lower profile and will blend with the rest of the area much better
- 11 Acres Citizens using only 1 acre
- Land to the west part of the pipeline (Water company will have to maintain)




- Land to the east for sale, \$1.6 million 8 acres
  - o City Council not rezoned
  - $\circ\quad$  We will need to make sure to monitor for any rezoning requests on this property
- Access
  - Allow 1 (one) cut driveway
- Zoned Single family
  - o Can break up into no more than 3 parcels
  - Could have a drive off 146<sup>th</sup> Street
  - o Councilman Mike Johns will look into removing the corner from "TIF"


### **Oakridge Road Crossing**

  - Pipeline and AT&T agreed to arborvitae(s) originally promised not keeping up their end of the agreement

  - Article III Meetings of Members
    - Section 4 Notice of Meetings
      - Section 4. Notice of Meetings. A written or printed notice stating the place, day, and hour of the meeting and, in the case of a special meeting, the purpose for which the meeting is called, shall be delivered or mailed by the secretary, or by the officer or person calling the meeting to each member of record entitled to vote at the meeting by the Articles of Incorporation, at the address which appears on the records of the Corporation, at least ten (10) days before the date of the meeting. Notice of any meeting of members may be waived in writing by any member and filed with the secretary or by attendance in person.
  - Article IV Board of Directors
    - Section 8 Resignation and Removal
      - Section 8. Resignation and Removal. Any directors may resign at any time by delivering to the secretary of the Corporation his written resignation, and if the same is not sooner accepted, such resignation shall be considered as having been accepted and as having become effective within ten (10) days after its date. Board may vote to remove another board member from service if any board member is absent for 3 consecutive meetings and fails to submit a status report or 2 consecutive meetings; or fails to perform, or knowingly violates his fiduciary duties as a board member.
